With updates to our interactive online application for admissions, we wanted to provide some information that might be helpful for you and seniors who are applying to HCC.

1. Students need to complete the online [Application for Admissions](#).
2. At the end of the application, a screen will announce “Congratulations” and explain that the student has been provisionally accepted. This simply means that in order for a student to move to “regular” student status, they must provide an official high school transcript with a graduation date.
3. Students need to print this page because it serves as confirmation of their acceptance to HCC, provides them with their ID number, and states that they will receive an email with instructions on how to access DragonZone, their student web portal.
4. Students must log in to their DragonZone account in order to complete their registration with HCC.

In addition, we have added a [“Frequently Asked Questions”](#) section to the High School Counselor page on our website. We hope that this serves as a helpful tool as you assist students with their higher education goals.

After completing their [Application for Admissions](#), students will set up a DragonZone account, their 24-hour gateway to HCC. Students can complete the online scholarship application in DragonZone under the **Finance** tab.

In addition to completing the application, students must submit an unofficial high school transcript to the Admissions office for GPA verification.


Priority deadline for the scholarship application is **February 15th!**

24-Hour Play Festival

Hutchinson Community College Theatre will host the 24-Hour Play Festival, February 17-18. The production will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, February 18, at the B.J. Warner Recital Hall in the Stringer Fine Arts Center on the HCC campus.

The event requires 24 actors, six playwrights, six directors and six technicians, who begin work on Friday, February 17, to complete the entire production of six ten-minute plays. The 24-hour time clock starts with the actors, who are required to bring a costume and a unique prop to the initial production meeting, which will then inspire the writers and directors to begin the actual creation of the play.

The group will then work throughout the night and the next day to finalize the productions for the 7:30 curtain. More than 50 individuals will be involved in the production, including professional actors, community members, HCC and local high school students, and faculty from area high schools and colleges. In addition, a professional playwright from New York City will also participate in the event. The playwright will be announced as the festival date nears. This is the second year for the 24-Hour Play Festival on campus. Last year, the group performed six plays, including one written by Nathan Louis Jackson, a playwright and television writer with the Showtime show *Shameless*.

Tickets can be purchased at the Stringer Fine Arts Center information office during normal business hours. Tickets are also available to purchase from the box office one hour prior to the curtain.
