## Advanced Placement

Students need to be aware that while Hutchinson Community College offers credit by examination, baccalaureate-granting institutions have differing policies. Therefore, students should check with the transfer institution they plan to attend for its specific policy. The granting of credit by examination by HCC does not guarantee transferability.

Advanced Placement (AP) refers specifically to courses offered in some high schools which are constructed and coordinated under the supervision of the College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB).

Students who have completed any of the following CEEB Advanced Placement tests should have the Educational Testing Service (ETS) forward an official report of their scores to the Registrar's Office at Hutchinson Community College in order to receive credit.
