HCC WOMEN HIT THE ROAD TO BATTLE IMPROVING BUTLER GRIZZLIES

The Hutchinson Community College women's basketball team goes after its third-straight Jayhawk Conference Western Division victory, and its second on the road, when the Lady Dragons travel to Butler on Wednesday night for a 5:30 p.m. tipoff at the Power Plant in El Dorado.

The game will be broadcast live on Blue Dragon flagship station KHUT-FM (102.9) with Glen Grunwald (play-by-play) and Rusty Hilst (analyst) beginning at 5:20 p.m. The game will also be broadcast on the Internet on the Blue Dragon Sports Network.

HCC comes into the game with a 15-2 overall record and a 2-1 mark in the Jayhawk West. The Lady Dragons won their second-straight game on Saturday night with an uneven 64-49 victory over Garden City at the Sports Arena.

The Lady Dragons held Garden City to 18.5 percent shooting in the first half, but were outscored 34-33 in the second half.

Butler (9-7, 1-1) has had a week off,

getting their first bye week on Saturday night. One week ago, the Grizzlies lost on the road to Garden City, but opened the league season with a home victory over Dodge City on Jan. 3.

Butler is 7-0 at the Power Plant this season. Hutchinson is 4-1 overall away from home, 3-1 in true road games.

HCC head coach John Ontjes goes after his 40th victory in his second season with the Lady Dragons. Ontjes is 39-10.

Hutchinson will get its first bye week on Saturday before playing host to Barton next Wednesday night.

Head Coach John Ontjes

Former Blue Dragon basketball great John Ontjes became the Hutchinson Community College women's basketball program's sixth head coach on Aug. 9, 2007.



In his first season at HCC, Ontjes guided the Lady Dragons to a 24-8 record, which tied for the third-most wins in school history, a fourth-place league finish and a quarterfinal berth in the Region VI Tournament.

Ontjes is currently 39-10 at HCC.

An all-state athlete at Nickerson, Ontjes played for the Blue Dragons in 1992 and 1993. Ontjes' teams were a combined 56-12. He ranks No. 1 in career assists (396) and career steals (145). He also ranks first in single-season assists (230).

In 2005, Ontjes was voted by the fans onto the 75th Anniversary all-time Blue Dragon men's basketball team.

Ontjes took over the HCC women's basketball program after a successful two-year run as head girls basketball coach at Hutchinson High School. In just two seasons, he took a Salthawk girls program with very little varsity experience at the beginning and quickly molded it into a state tournament contender.

Hutchinson High went 10-11 in Ontjes' first season in 2005 using mainly underclassmen,

including several freshmen. In 2006, the Salthawks qualified for the Class 5A state tournament and finished third in the state with a 19-6 overall record.

While playing at Oklahoma, Ontjes was named the Big Eight Newcomer of the Year after the 1994 season. He led OU averaging 6.5 assists per game, seventh on OU's single-season assist list. As a senior, Ontjes averaged 6.8 assists per game, which was fifth on the Oklahoma single-season assist list. He was named All-Big Eight honorable mention and to the Big Eight All-Underrated team.

With his 24 victories in his rookie season at HCC, Ontjes had more wins in his first year than any other Lady Dragon coach.

BALANCE KEY TO LADY DRAGON OFFENSIVE SUCCESS

While you won't find a single Lady Dragon player among the scoring leaders in Region VI, the HCC women's basketball team is having one of its best offensive seasons in team history.

One reason is scoring balance. While HCC doesn't have one dominant scorer, the Lady Dragons have eight players scoring six or more points per game. That's translated to a scoring average of 77.4 points per game through 17 games.

How balanced has HCC's offense been? Five difference Lady Dragon players have reached 15 or more points in a game this season. Last season, one player (All-American Amanda Fessenden) had 16 of HCC's 22 15-plus point games.

A pair of freshman lead the way in scoring. Heather Robben is averaging 13.4 points per game and Ariella McGhee is averaging 12.5 points per game. Right behind is freshman Naudia Campbell (10.3 ppg), sophomore Brittany Hines (9.4 ppg) and sophomore Lauren Sparks (8.9 ppg).

While the Lady Dragons' offensive average will likely dip some in the conference season, the Lady Dragons have a good chance to break the school scoring average record.

The current record is 74.5 points per game set in 1979-80.

LADY DRAGONS HOPE TO CONTINUE DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE IN '08-'09

Over the last six seasons, the Lady Dragons have been one of the top defensive teams in the NJCAA.

So far this season, that hasn't changed. The Lady Dragons are second in Region VI and are 16th in the nation in scoring defense at 53.7 points per game.

HCC is allowing teams just 30.9 percent shooting, 29.6 percent from 3-point range. HCC is forcing 24.4 turnovers per contest.

Only one team (Crowder College) has shot better than 40 percent against the Lady Dragons this season. Seven teams have shot less than 30 percent vs. HCC.

In each of the last five seasons, HCC has been ranked in the NJCAA's Top 10 in defensive scoring average, including 2004 when the Lady Dragons were the top defensive team in the country, allowing a scant 48 points per game.

In head coach John Ontjes' first season in 2007-08, the Lady Dragons were eighth in the nation allowing 51.7 points per game. Opposing teams shot just 32.3 percent and just 24.7 percent from 3-point range. HCC held opponents to less than 40 points six times last season.

LADY DRAGONS PROGRAM IS A CONSISTENT WINNER

HCC started women's basketball in 1974. The Lady Dragons have amassed a record of 668-318. The 1976-77 team won the only Region VI championship and finished fourth in the nation.

The Lady Dragons have been consistent winners, notching winning records in 32 of 34 seasons. Hutchinson has had at least 20 wins in a season 18 times and has won at least 15 games in 28 of 34 seasons.

The Lady Dragons notched their 18th 20-win season on Feb. 13, 2008 with a 74-39 victory over Dodge City at the Sports Arena.

The 2007-08 Lady Dragons had 24 victories, which tied for the third-most wins in a season, matching the 1997-98 team (24-8) and the 1999-2000 team (24-8).

HOME COOKING GOOD TO LADY DRAGONS

The Lady Dragons are 362-109 all-time in 34 seasons at the Sports Arena.

Win No. 350 came in a 67-62 victory over No. 19 Cloud County on March 1, 2008. HCC's 300th victory at the Sports Arena was a 54-44 win over Neosho County on Nov. 28, 2003.

Only twice have the Lady Dragons been undefeated in a season at home. They were 10-0 in 1977 and 8-0 in 1978. The 1999-2000 team posted an 18-3 home record, which are the most victories in a single season as the Sports Arena.

The 2007-08 Lady Dragons were 16-1 at the Sports Arena.

LADY DRAGONS ON COMMERCIAL RADIO

The HCC women's basketball team for the first time will have a limited schedule of games broadcast on Blue Dragon flagship radio station KHUT-FM this season. All five games will be Jayhawk Conference battles.

Glen Grunwald, the voice of HCC men's basketball, and Rusty Hilst, longtime Blue Dragon football and men's basketball announcer, will be the on-air personalities.

Four games remain on the commercial broadcast schedule. They are: Wednesday, Jan. 14 at Butler; Wednesday, Jan. 21 vs. Barton; Wednesday, February 18 at Barton; Saturday, Feb. 28 vs. Cloud County.

All 16 Lady Dragon conference games will continue to be broadcast on the Blue Dragon Sports Network, the internet home of Lady Dragon basketball.

SERIES HISTORY WITH THE GRIZZLIES

This will be the 66th meeting all-time between Hutchinson and Butler. The Lady Dragons have an overall 39-26 series advantage.

HCC leads the series in games played at the Sports Arena 21-11 and leads 18-15 at the Power Plant in El Dorado. The teams have never played on a neutral floor or Region VI competition.

Last season, Hutchinson swept the season series for the first time since the 2005 season. HCC won at Butler 76-59 and then defeated the Grizzlies 65-58 at the Sports Arena one month later.

SCOUTING BUTLER

Once of the the powers in the Jayhawk Conference Western Division, the Butler Grizzlies have had some lean times over the past several years. First-year coach Mike Helmer is changing that this season.

Butler is 9-7 overall and 1-1 in the Jayhawk West. The Grizzlies are very athletic and quick and have one of the more dynamic point guards in the country in Angie Criner. The Division I transfer from Arkansas State is 20th in the nation and is second in Region VI at 17.8 points per game.

The Grizzlies have two others scoring in double figures. Sophomore Brittany Aldrich is at 10.9 points per game and shoots 43 percent from 3-point range. Alysia Hart averages 10.4 points per game.

Offensively, the Grizzlies average 65.8 points per game, shooting 38.9 percent overall and 32.2 percent from 3-point range. Butler struggles from the free-throw line at 56 percent and is a minus-3.8 in rebounding margin.

Defensively, Butler allows 59.9 points, 38.7 percent overall shooting and 27.6 percent from long range.

LAST SEASON AGAINST THE GRIZZLIES

● **Jan. 9 at El Dorado (HCC 76, Butler 59)** - Amanda Fessenden scored 20 points to lead the Lady Dragons to their sixth-straight victory.

Fessenden hit three huge 3-point goals to post her first 20-point game in eight games. Two of her treys came in a first-half surge that saw HCC build an eight-point lead into an 18-point cushion. Her streak of 13 straight made free throws did come to an end with a miss on her first foul shot of the night. Fessenden then hit the next five in a row.

Freshman point guard Lauren Sparks knocked down a season-high 12 points, going 7 of 8 from the stripe (both of those marks were season highs as well). Her previous scoring high came against Northern Oklahoma with 11 points.

Freshman Brittany Hines and sophomore Amber Schroer also scored in double figures, with 13 and 11 points, respectively.

Hutchinson shot 25 of 60 from the field (41.7 percent) and 5 of 12 from beyond the arc. HCC was 21 of 27 (77.8 percent) from the free-throw line and committed 18 turnovers.

For only the second time this season, the Lady Dragons were outrebounded. Butler had a huge second-half rebounding margin and finished outboarding HCC 46-34, the widest negative deficit for the Lady Dragons this season. Schroer led HCC with six rebounds.

Butler shot 37.3 percent overall (22 of 59) and 4 of 14 from long range. The Grizzlies were 11 of 17 from the stripe, but committed 32 turnovers in which Hutchinson converted into 34 points. The Grizzlies did garner 18 offensive rebounds and scored 17 second-chance points.

Forward Tiffany Stokes scored 17 of her team-high 19 points in the second half to lead the Grizzlies. Sophomore Lekeisha Levi, the 12th-leading scorer in the nation, was held seven points under her 19 point-per-game average with 12 points on 3 of 7 shooting.

● **Feb. 9 at Hutchinson (HCC 65, Butler 58)** - One of the worst halves of basketball by the 21st-ranked Lady Dragons was followed its largest comeback.

Trailing by as many as 15 points, the Lady Dragons rallied for a 65-58 victory.

HCC trailed by 13 at the half and 37-22 in the first minute of the second half before freshman Morgan Leatherbury helped ignite a 25-6 run to overtake the Grizzlies.

Leatherbury scored 12 of her team-high 15 points in the second half, scoring eight points in that early second-half run. Leatherbury had a tremendous all-around game against Butler with three rebounds, three assists and two steals.

Sophomore Amanda Fessenden tied Leatherbury for team-high scoring honors with 15 points, hitting two critical 3-point goals. Sophomore Fairen Lepaio chipped in eight points, while freshman Kylee Naccarato and sophomore Nikki Lawrence had seven points each.

After shooting near 20 percent for most of the first half, HCC finished at 24 of 59 shooting (40.9 percent). Hutch was 16 of 35 from the field in the second half (45.7 percent).

The nation's third-leading 3-point shooting team hit 10 of 19 from 3-point range, the second time this season that the Lady Dragons have had 10 or more treys in a contest.

The Lady Dragons struggled again from the foul line, going 7 of 15. HCC had 16 turnovers, but only four in the second half.

Butler came out and shot 50 percent in the first half, but cooled down in the second half to shoot just 34.6 percent, and finished at 42.3 percent (22 of 52). The Grizzlies hit 4 of 6 3-pointers in the first half, but finished 1 of 7. Butler was 9 of 14 from the free-throw line as a team.

They were led by sophomore Lekeshia Levi, who had her third double-double against HCC with 14 points and 11 rebounds. Tiffany Stokes had 11 points, but only two points after halftime.

HCC was outrebounded by the Grizzlies for the second time this season and for only the fourth time this season. Butler had a 41-33 rebounding advantage and turned the ball over 26 times.

HCC'S LAST GAME - GARDEN CITY

Freshman Heather Robben had a game-high 18 points to lead four Lady Dragons in double figures and freshman Naudia Campbell posted her fifth double-double of the season as the Lady Dragons defeated Garden City 62-49 on Saturday night at the Sports Arena.

The Lady Dragons (15-2, 2-1 Jayhawk West) held Garden City to just 15 points on 18.5-percent shooting in the first half. But the second half was a different story. Leading 50-29 with 10:38 left in the game, Hutchinson was outscored 20-12 the rest of the way with the Broncbusters drawing as close as eight points (56-48) with 1:57 left.

HCC shot just 30 percent in the second half and didn't have a field goal in the final 6 minutes of the game.

Hutchinson shot a season-low 30.9 percent (21 of 68) and was just 3 of 15 from 3-point range. HCC was also 17 of 26 from the free-throw line. HCC had just 14 turnovers and battled to a 51-51 draw on the boards.

Robben finished with 18 points, eight rebounds and three steals. Campbell had 14 points and a season high-tying 13 rebounds with three blocked shots. Sophomore Lauren Sparks and freshman Brittney Chamberlin had 11 points each.

Garden City (7-9, 1-1) was held to 28.1 percent shooting (16 of 57), but was 6 of 16 from long range. The Busters were just 11 of 23 from the free-throw line and committed 27 turnovers. The Busters blocked nine shots.

Katie Novack, Garden City's leading scorer, hit four 3-pointers, but was held to 12 points, with six rebounds and four steals. LeMesia Abbott had nine points, while Cheree Freeman and Deidre Mays had eight points each. Mays had 13 rebounds, the most allowed to an HCC opponent this season.

Hutchinson led 29-15 at halftime, holding Garden City to just 5 of 27 shooting (18.5 percent).

LADY DRAGONS IN NJCAA RANKINGS

After breaking into the NJCAA Division I women's national rankings in the final week of November, HCC's first loss of the season sent the Lady Dragons' back out of the last December national poll.

In the latest poll released on Wednesday, HCC was no longer receiving votes despite a 14-2 record.

The Lady Dragons were receiving votes in the last 2008 poll. Coffeyville, the team that knocked HCC from the unbeaten ranks, is also receiving votes.

Former and future Lady Dragon opponents to be ranked are: South Plains (No. 12), Cloud County (No. 16).

Robben is currently the Lady Dragons' leading scorer at 13.4 points per game. She is shooting 42.7 percent overall and 30.9 percent from 3-point range. She also is No. 1 in Region VI from the free-throw line, shooting 83.1 percent from the field.

Robben, not known as much of a rebounder at Maize High School, is averaging 5.9 rebounds per game and has a season high of 13 against the McPherson College Junior Varsity.

Robben has one double-double this season (14 points, 13 rebounds vs. McPherson). She has a season high of 24 points against Kansas City in the Jayhawk Shootout.

HOMETOWN DRAGON HINES SHOWING LEADERSHIP

With only three healthy returning sophomores back from last year's 24-8 team, local product Brittany Hines has been counted on to be a team leader this season.

The 5-6 sophomore guard from Hutchinson (Buhler HS) is fourth on the team in scoring at 9.4 points per game. She is shooting 47.7 percent overall, but just 21.4 percent from 3-point range.

Hines has been battling through a recent slump, which saw her scoring average dip below 9 points per game. Over a three-game stretch since returning from Christmas, Hines was averaging just 3.6 points and shooting just 20 percent, making just 1 of 9 3-pointers.

On Jan. 7 against Dodge City, Hines wasn't in the starting lineup for the first time this season, but showed what kind of leader she was by tying her career high for points with a team-high 23, going 10 of 10 from the field.

SPARKS, KING HAVE BEEN SOLID RUNNING THE SHOW

In John Ontjes' first season at HCC, the point guard position was unsettled and inconsistent. That hasn't been the case in season No. 2.

Sophomore Lauren Sparks and freshman Sasha King have combined to average 7.1 assists per game to 5.2 turnovers per game this season. Last season, HCC's point guards averaged 4.8 assists to 6.2 turnovers.

Sparks, who has started 15 of 17 games, is averaging 3.8 assists per game. While King is averaging 3.2 assists per game. Both point have plus assist-to-turnover ratios.

LADY DRAGONS REACH 100-POINT MARK FOR 2ND TIME IN '08-'09

After scoring 100 or more points only four times in their first 34 seasons, the Lady Dragons have done so twice in the 2008-09 season.

The first time was a 102-46 victory over the Tabor College JV on Nov. 24. Then on Jan. 7, Hutch matched that output with a 102-32 victory over Dodge City.

Against the Conquistadors, the Lady Dragons broke the single-game school record for shot percentage, shooting a staggering 68.3 percent from the field (43 of 63). In the first half alone, HCC shot 78.6 percent (22 of 28), a school record for one half.

Against Tabor, the Lady Dragons weren't quite as efficient, but still managed to shoot 50 percent for the game (35 of 70) and hit 10 of 24 from the 3-point line and 22 of 32 at the free-throw line.

Before the Tabor game, it had been since 1994 that HCC had posted a 100-point game. The two 102-point games tie for the second-most points scored in a game.

McGHEE BREAKS REBOUNDING RECORD AGAIN

For the second time in four games, freshman Ariella McGhee broke the HCC single-game rebounding record, pulling down 20 rebounds against Seward County on Jan. 3.

Four games previous, against Hesston College, McGhee broke the record for the first time, pulling down 18 rebounds in an 86-43 victory over Hesston College on Dec. 13 to break the 22-year-old mark that was held by Penny Fisher since 1986.

On Nov. 8 against Marshalltown, McGhee had 17 rebounds, which tied the record.

McGhee, who leads the Jayhawk Conference and is fourth in the nation in rebounding, is averaging 11.0 boards per contest. She already has seven games of 10 or more rebounds.

LADY DRAGONS SECURE ANOTHER 10-WIN NON-CONFERENCE SEASON

With victories over Crowder College and Hesston College at the HCC Christmas Classic at the Sports Arena, the Lady Dragons secured their 25th non-conference season of 10 or more wins. This is the 16th-straight year for HCC to reach that mark.

With victories over Grayson County and Collin County, Texas, over the Christmas break, the Lady Dragons ended the non-conference season with a 13-1 record. The 13 non-league wins are third most, and it's the sixth time in program history to be reached (2008-09, 2004-05, 1999-2000, 1995-96, 1994-95, 1988-89).

Only three other HCC teams have had more non-conference victories. The record for non-conference wins is 18 set by the 1989-90 team. The 1987-88 and 2001-02 teams are second with 14 wins.

LADY DRAGONS COMPLETE TEXAS TWO-STEP

● **Grayson County** - Freshman Ariella McGhee posted her fifth double-double of the season and Lady Dragons overcame 27 turnovers and foul trouble to defeat Grayson County College 69-67 on the first day of a two-day swing through the state of Texas on Dec. 28.

Hutchinson led 30-28 at halftime and led for most of the second half. After freshman Heather Robben hit 1 of 2 free throws with 5 seconds remaining in the game, the Lady Dragons had to make a defensive stop and did so without the Vikings (4-5) getting off a shot. This was the closest margin of victory for HCC this season.

McGhee finished with 12 points and 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. McGhee scored 10 of her 12 points in the second half before fouling out.

Robben led the Lady Dragons in scoring with 17 points. Freshman Naudia Campbell was a perfect 5 of 5 shooting with six rebounds before fouling out. Sophomore Lauren Sparks had 11 points and tied a career high with eight assists.

Hutchinson shot a season-high 53.1 percent (26 of 49) and was a sizzling 59.3 percent (16 of 27) in the second half. HCC was 5 of 11 from 3-point range; all five were in the opening 20 minutes. The Lady Dragons were 12 of 19 from the free-throw line. Hutch outrebounded a very athletic Grayson County team 36-28.

The Lady Dragons had to overcome foul trouble in the post and 27 turnovers which led to 32 Grayson County points. In the first half alone, HCC had 17 turnovers, which led to 21 Viking points.

Defensively, Hutchinson held Grayson County to 37.5 percent shooting (21 of 56). The Vikings were just 9 of 31 in the first half (29 percent), but HCC turnovers kept the Vikings in the game in the first half. Grayson County was 5 of 17 from 3-point range and 20 of 25 from the free-throw line. Grayson County had 19 turnovers, but had 13 steals. Grayson County scored the second-most points against Hutchinson this season.

HCC held Grayson's leading scorer, Taisja Jones to 15 points, seven points below her season scoring average. Averaging nearly 30 points per game in her last four, Jones was just 3 of 14 shooting against Hutchinson, but was 9 of 11 from the free-throw line.

● **Collin County** - Trailing by as many as 10 points in the first half, the Lady Dragons overcame a slow offensive start and mounted a second-half comeback to defeat Collin County 57-53 on Dec. 29.

HCC trailed 26-21 at halftime and fell behind 41-32 with 12:24 to play in the second half. But HCC outscored Collin County 25-12 the rest of the way, led by Heather Robben, who scored all 12 of her points in the final 20 minutes.

Naudia Campbell and Brittney Chamberlin scored 10 points each and Lauren Sparks added nine, including the final four points of the game in the final 39 seconds, which broke a 53-all tie.

The Lady Dragons shot 39.2 percent overall (20 of 51) and was 7 of 17 from 3-point range. Robben had a season-high three treys. HCC hit only 10 of 17 free throws and was outrebounded for the second time this season, 44-36. Collin County converted 20 offensive rebounds into 11 points.

Defensively, HCC held the Cougars 23 points under their season scoring average, limiting Collin County to 19 of 62 shooting (30.9 percent). The Cougars were 3 of 20 from 3-point range and just 12 of 21 from the free-throw line. Collin County was No. 4 in the nation in free-throw shooting.

HCC HAS HISTORICAL PERFORMANCES AGAINST BETHANY, TABOR JVs

The Lady Dragons did some re-writing of the record books in a pair of blowout wins over the Bethany College and Tabor College junior varsity squads on Nov. 22 and Nov. 25, respectively.

Against Bethany, the Lady Dragons pounded the Swedes 95-34. The 95 points tied for the seventh-most points by the HCC women and was the seventh-largest margin of victory in a game.

Four days later, Hutchinson scored 100 points in a game for the first time since 1994 and for just the fifth time in program history in a 102-46 win over Tabor College. The 56-point margin of victory was the 11th largest in program history.

It's the first time in program history that HCC has scored 90 points or more in back-to-back games.

LADY DRAGONS TOPPLE NO. 9 SOUTH PLAINS

Freshman Ariella McGhee posted her third double-double of the season and the Lady Dragons remained unbeaten by knocking off No. 9-ranked South Plains College, Texas, 65-59 in the final game of the 2008 HCC Women's Thanksgiving Classic on Saturday night at the Sports Arena.

The Lady Dragons (8-0) held South Plains (11-2) to its second-lowest point total and lowest shot percentage of the season en route to their first victory over a nationally ranked opponent this season.

McGhee had 13 points and 15 rebounds for her third double-double in eight games. McGhee's rebounding performance was key in HCC outrebounding a quick and big South Plains front line 42-40.

Freshman Naudia Campbell added 12 points, eight rebounds and two blocked shots. Sophomores Brittany Hines and Briyana Evans and freshman Heather Robben scored nine points each. Sophomore Lauren Sparks had seven points.

The Lady Dragons shot 37.7 percent overall (20 of 53) and was 3 of 7 from 3-point range (42.9 percent). HCC's key stat was going 22 of 26 from the free-throw line, 14 of 17 in the second half.

South Plains, coached by former HCC women's basketball assistant Michelle Wyatt, was held to a season-low 31.1 percent (19 of 61), going 6 of 13 from 3-point range and 15 of 20 from the free-throw line. Dayon Hall-Jones had a game-high 18 points to lead the Lady Texans, while leading scorer Taniqua Ards was held to 11 points. Sajoyia Griffin hit three 3-point goals and had 11 points.

HCC RALLIES FROM 20 DOWN TO TOPPLE MARSHALLTOWN

Sophomore Brittany Hines scored a career-high 23 points and freshman Ariella McGhee tied a team rebounding record to power a huge comeback against on the final night of the Grand Prairie Hotel Classic on Nov. 8.

HCC trailed by 20 points in the first half, but battled back to defeat Marshalltown 75-68.

Hines ignited the second-half rally scoring 13 points in helping HCC outscore Marshalltown (3-1) 44-25 in the final 20 minutes. Hines finished shooting 8 of 10 from the field, including 2 of 2 from 3-point range.

McGhee tied a 22-year-old team record pulling down 17 rebounds on Saturday night. McGhee broke the 1986 record of 17 by Penny Fischer.

But individual efforts were overshadowed by HCC's comeback from a 20-point first-half deficit. Marshalltown hit 8 of its first 16 shots and built a 24-4 lead with 9:50 to play in the first half after a Megan Stanton 3-point goal. Hutchinson, over the first 10 minutes was just 1 of 9 shooting.

The Lady Dragons slowly started to turn things around in the latter stages of the opening half. A Hines basket with 7:32 to play capped a 12-3 Lady Dragon run to cut the deficit to single digits at 24-16. HCC trailed 43-31 at halftime.

Hutch eventually erased the entire 20-point deficit midway through the second half and then dominated the final 10 minutes of the game, completing a 33-point turnaround, building a 13-point lead with 3:14 to play in the game.

LADY DRAGONS PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH IN JAYHAWK WEST

The Lady Dragons were picked to finish fourth in the 2009 Jayhawk West championship race this season by a vote of the league's coaches.

Cloud County, ranked No. 7 in the preseason NJCAA poll, was the coaches' choice to win the West championship. Preseason No. 17 Seward County was picked to finish second and defending Jayhawk West and Region VI champion Barton Community College was picked third.

HCC's 79-14 season opening victory this season was the largest home-opening margin of victory, which was also the third largest in history.

The most points scored in a home opener was 88, which happened twice. Hutch won 88-42 over Brown Mackie College in 1995. That tied the 1980 opener against Allen County in which Hutch poured in 88 points.

2008-09 LADY DRAGONS TO LEAN ON SOPHOMORES

The Lady Dragons have four returning guards from last year's 24-8 team that lost to Independence in the Region VI quarterfinals. Those four returning players represent 33 percent of the scoring, 18 percent of the rebounding and 43 percent of the 3-pointers made from last season.

Kylee Naccarato, a 5-foot-7 sophomore from Hutchinson, is the leading returning scorer who averaged 6.7 points per game and shot 47.3 percent from 3-point range.

Brittany Hines, a 5-6 sophomore from Hutchinson (Buhler High School), averaged 6.1 points and shot 28 percent from long range.

Lauren Sparks, a 5-6 sophomore from Wollongong, Australia, averaged 6.6 points and tied for the team lead with 86 assists.

Briyana Evans is a 5-7 sophomore from Southfield, Mich. She averaged just under a point per game last season.

NATALIE PURCELL IS HCC'S FIRST-EVER HOOPS OLYMPIAN

Hutchinson Community College had its first female athlete ever to compete in the Olympics when Natalie Purcell played for the New Zealand women's national team in the 2008 Summer Games in Beijing.

Purcell was the first HCC athlete to compete in the Olympics since Steve Fritz finished fourth in the decathlon in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta.

Purcell, a 6-foot forward who played at Hutchinson in 2002-03 and 2003-04, was an All-Jayhawk Conference performer for the Lady Dragons in 2004.

She was the 2003-04 team's leading scorer and rebounder averaging 11.5 points and 7.6 rebounds. Purcell was one of the team's top 3-point shooters with 33. Purcell had 16 points and 11 rebounds in a 64-50 victory over Seward County, which snapped the Saints' 135-game home-court winning streak.

Purcell played in all five New Zealand games, averaging 3.2 points. She had an Olympics-high six points in a loss to the United State.

New Zealand went 1-4 in pool play.
