NO. 6 BLUE DRAGONS LOOK FOR 3-0 START WITH A TOUGH ROAD TRIP TO DODGE CITY

The Hutchinson Community College football team aims for its first 3-0 start to a season since 2004 when the No. 6-ranked Blue Dragons travel to Dodge City for a Jayhawk Conference showdown.

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. at Dodge City's Memorial Stadium. The game will be broadcast live by Blue Dragon flagship station KHUT-FM (102.9) with Rusty Hilst (play-by-play) and Glen Grunwald (analyst) calling the action at 6:50 p.m. The game can also be heard on the internet on the Blue Dragon Sports Network (www.hutchcc.edu/dragons) at 6:50 p.m.

Dodge City is a place that traditionally the Blue Dragons haven't played well at. HCC has lost six straight at Dodge City, not winning there since 1998. In 1997, HCC went in ranked No. 14 in the NJCAA poll and lost 12-10 in a driving rainstorm.

The Blue Dragons play their next two on the road - Saturday vs. Dodge City and next week at No. 8 Fort Scott - before returning home for a possible Top 5 matchup with Butler. The Dragons can't afford to look past an 0-2 Dodge City team that has struggled in its first three games, getting outscored 129-41.

The Coaches

Hutchinson's Rion Rhoades is in his third season with the Blue Dragons. He is 11-11 at HCC and 18-16 overall in his fourth season as a collegiate head coach.

Dodge City's Bob Majeski is in his second season with the Conquistadors. His record with Dodge City is 2-0.

The Series

The Blue Dragons own a 40-33-4 overall advantage in their series with Dodge City. Last season, HCC snapped a five-game losing streak to the Conqs. Hutchinson is 17-20-2 at Memorial Stadium in Dodge City.

ABOUT BLUE DRAGON HEAD COACH RION RHOADES

As a Blue Dragon player in the mid-1990s, Rion Rhoades was a tough, aggressive, intense linebacker. He brings those same qualities as the third-year head coach of the Hutchinson Community College football team.

Named the program's 17th head coach on December 12, 2006, Rhoades was a part of HCC's 1993 and 1994 teams under coaches Sam Pittman and Andy Hill. Those teams put down the foundation for the 1995 Blue Dragons that won the team's last Jayhawk Conference championship.

Now 12 years into his coaching career, Rhoades is working on rebuilding the Blue Dragons back to that level. Rhoades is 11-11 at Hutchinson, leading the 2008 Blue Dragons to a 7-4 record and a Region VI runner-up finish and No. 19 final ranking. Rhoades is 18-16 overall in four years as a collegiate head coach.

Rhoades came to HCC after guiding Fort Scott Community College to a remarkable one-year turnaround.

Entering the 2006 season, Fort Scott was mired in a 22-game losing streak. Rhoades guided Fort Scott to a 7-5 record, a Region VI semifinal victory over Coffeyville on the road, a berth in the Region VI championship game and a spot in the 2006 Heart of Texas Bowl. The Greyhounds also finished with a No. 11 national ranking.

He now has the honor of being the HCC head coach who stopped a program-record 13-game losing streak, defeating Highland 35-12 on Sept. 8, 2007.

Rhoades, who knows a little something about winning football after playing at Kansas Class 5A power Liberal, still has the distinction of being the Blue Dragons' third all-time leading tackler with 268 stops.

A two-year starter for Pittman and Hill, Rhoades was an All-Jayhawk Conference Honorable Mention selection twice.



BLUE DRAGONS IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

The Blue Dragons moved up one notch to No. 6 in the latest NJCAA/JC Football.com regular-season national poll released on Tuesday.

The Blue Dragons earned their first top 10 national ranking in 13 years last week when the Blue Dragons came it at No. 7.

HCC has now been ranked in seven consecutive national polls, the longest streak of being ranked since a run of 27 consecutive polls from 1994 to 1996.

Hutchinson's last Top 10 national football ranking came in 1996 after starting that season 3-0, including a 39-25 victory over then-No. 2 Garden City. Hutchinson was ranked No. 4 in the NJCAA poll and earned the program's first No. 1 ranking ever by JC Gridwire.

For the first time since 2005, the Blue Dragons were ranked in the NJCAA Preseason national football poll. HCC opened the season No. 13. The last time that Hutchinson was ranked in the preseason poll came in 2005 when the Blue Dragons started that season ranked No. 16.

Hutchinson is one of three Jayhawk Conference teams ranked in current Top 10. Defending national champion Butler is No. 5, while Fort Scott is No. 8.

RB ANDERSON NAMED NJCAA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF WEEK

Freshman running back Chris Anderson had the hot hand on Sept. 12 against Highland and his performance earned him NJCAA National Offensive Player of the Week honors last Wednesday.

Anderson (5-10, 193, Lauderdale Lakes, Fla.) had a school-record six touchdowns in a 58-6 victory over Highland at Gowans Stadium. Rushing 20 times for 120 yards, Anderson scored on runs of 4, 11, 6, 1, 5 and 1 yard. It was the first collegiate 100-yard game for the transfer from Troy University.

Anderson surpassed the old record of five touchdowns set by Jamison Palmer against Independence in a first-round Jayhawk Conference Playoff game in 1998.

Anderson is also helping the Blue Dragons lead the nation in rushing at 346.5 yards per game.

Anderson becomes HCC's first national player of the week since Thatcher Starling was named co-NJCAA Defensive player of the week last season.

He is the he first Blue Dragon since Danny McEvoy in 2007 to earn the national offensive player of the week award.

LAST GAME: ANDERSON HAS RECORD 6 TDS IN ROUT OF SCOTTIES

The No. 7-ranked Hutchinson Community College football team rode the hot hand of freshman running back Chris Anderson as the Blue Dragons hammered the Highland Scotties 58-6 in the 2009 home and Jayhawk Conference opener on Saturday night at Gowans Stadium.

Anderson rushed for a season-high 120 yards and a team single-game record of six touchdowns as the Blue Dragons exacted some revenge on the Scotties for last year's 23-10 loss at Highland.

Anderson breaks the old record of five touchdowns, set by Jamison Palmer against Independence in a 1998 Jayhawk Conference playoff game. Anderson had touchdown runs of 4, 11, 6, 1, 5 and 1 yard.

Two weeks ago, it was Chris Clay that HCC rode to a win over NEO with 231 yards. On Saturday, it was Anderson's turn to shine against the Scotties.

Hutchinson scored the third-most points in series history against the Scotties. The Blue Dragons (2-0, 1-0 Jayhawk Conference) rushed for 288 yards and eight touchdowns and had 357 yards of total offense. The Dragons have scored 106 points in their first two games.

Seven different running backs carried the ball for Hutchinson. Clay, who was not feeling well at game time, had 64 yards on 12 carries and one TD. Freshman Cordell Reed rushed for 44 and a score and freshman Romero Cotton rushed for 34 yards.

Freshman quarterback Angelo Pease completed just 5 of 15 passes for 55 yards and he rushed for 27 more.

Thanks to a much-improved defensive effort, strong return game and five Highland turnovers, the Blue Dragons had great field position all night. Hutch started 11 of 16 drives in Scotty territory and the average starting line of scrimmage was the Highland 40. Meanwhile, the Scotties' average starting position was its own 21 and they took just three snaps from inside HCC territory.

Highland finished with just 133 yards of total offense, getting 124 through the air and just nine yards rushing. The Dragons had three quarterback sacks and eight total tackles for loss.

SCOUTING THE CONQUISTADORS

After a strong finish to the 2008 season - two straight wins to close after starting 0-7 - Dodge City was picked as one of those "teams to watch" in 2009.

Thus far in 2009, that hasn't materialized as Dodge City is off to an 0-3 overall start and an 0-2 start in the Jayhawk Conference. After a strong effort against nationally ranked Trinity Valley - Dodge lost 27-13 - the Conquistadors lost 51-7 to No. 4 Butler and 51-21 to upstart Independence last week.

Defensively, the Conquistadors have had trouble stopping opposing running games. Dodge City is allowing 249.7 yards on the ground, 459 yards of total offense all together and 43 points per game. Dodge gave up 327 yards rushing to Independence last week.

Offensively, Dodge City hasn't gotten the passing game untracked. The Conqs are last in the Jayhawk Conference in passing at 96.7 yards per game. Second-year head coach Bob Majeski has tried a two-quarterback system. Justin Heard is 11 of 30 passing for 194 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Lane Kendall is 28 of 58 for 96 yards with a touchdown and three interceptions.

The lack of a passing attack has bogged down the Dodge City run game. Jacquese Seward leads the team with 193 yards, a 4.3-yards-per-attempt average, and two TDs. No other Dodge City back has more than 65 yards through the first three games.

The Conqs have turned the ball over nine times in three games and is a minus-2 in turnover ratio.

Defensively, linebacker Jared Loomis is the team's top tackler with 25. Laconia Blane is right behind with 23 and Mike Callis has 20. The Conqs have had only 13 tackles for loss through three games, but has forced seven turnovers.

LAST MEETING VS. DODGE CITY

Sophomore running back La'Darrian Page ran for a season-high 198 yards and two touchdowns, while the HCC defense scored for the third time as the Blue Dragons ran through Dodge City 40-6 on Sept. 20, 2008 at Gowans Stadium. Hutchinson snapped a five-game losing streak to Dodge City.

Page helped the Blue Dragons rush for 300 for the first time in 2008, rushing for a season-high 302 yards and four rushing touchdowns. The Blue Dragons controlled the ball for 38 minutes, 19 seconds, including a staggering 13 minutes, 54 seconds in the third quarter alone.

HCC ran the ball on 65 of 69 offensive plays against the Conquistadors.

Meanwhile, the Blue Dragon defense turned in dominating performance, holding Dodge City to 174 total yards, the second-straight game to hold an opponent to less than 200 total yards. The seventh-ranked rushing defense in the nation, HCC held the Conquistadors (0-4, 0-3) to just 49 yards on the ground.

Defensive tackle Eugene Kinlaw forced a safety in the second quarter, which is the third time this season that the defense has scored. It's the first time in 71 games (the 2001 season opener at Independence) that the Dragon defense has forced a safety.

Even the special teams got in on the act against Dodge City. After the Conquistadors scored a touchdown to cut the HCC lead to 9-6, freshman Gage McKinnis took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 97 yards - the second-longest kickoff return in program history - for a touchdown and a 16-6 lead late in the second quarter.

In addition to Page's big night, freshman Chris Clay ran the ball 18 times for 60 yards - both season highs - and his first career touchdown. Freshman Trezz Tillman ran nine times for 38 yards and his first career touchdown.

Back-up quarterback Jean Julmiste was Dodge City's leading rusher with 52 yards on 14 carries. Julmiste completed just six passes in 15 attempts for 112 yards.

Hutchinson's defense - led by sophomore linebacker Jamin Raigoza's nine total tackles and six by sophomore Thatcher Starling and Kinlaw - had 10 tackles for loss, including five quarterback sacks.

CLAY BECOMES FIRST BLUE DRAGON 200-YARD RUSHER SINCE 1998

HCC sophomore running back Chris Clay did something that even 2008 Jayhawk Conference Offensive Player of the Year La'Darrian Page couldn't do.

Against Northeastern Oklahoma A&M on Aug. 29, Clay became the first Blue Dragon to rush for more than 200 yards in a game since 1998 with a career-high 231-yard performance in HCC's 48-27 victory over the Golden Norsemen.

Clay becomes the first HCC back to surpass the 200-yard mark since All-American Jamison Palmer went for 261 yards against Independence in the first round of the Jayhawk Conference playoffs in 1998.

Clay, who is among the all-time leading prep rushers in the state of Georgia, had his fourth career 100-yard game and had surpassed his career high of 138 yards early in the second quarter, totaling 185 yards by halftime. He had seven runs of 10 or more yards in the first half alone, including scoring runs of 7 and 62 yards.

CHARTING RB CHRIS CLAY

In a back-up role to 2008 Jayhawk Conference offensive player of the year, LaDarrian Page, running back Chris Clay maximized his playing time last season.

Now the 5-10, 170-pound hard-charging back from Cuthbert, Ga., has started his sophomore season on fire.

Through two games, Clay has 295 yards rushing and three TDs, which is second in the Jayhawk Conference and sixth in the NJCAA.

Clay rushed for 231 yards on Aug 29 against Northeastern Oklahoma A&M and has begun the climb toward the Blue Dragon career Top 10 rushing list.

Last week against Highland, an under-the-weather Clay still rushed for 64 yards on 12 carries and a touchdown.

Clay has 924 career yards and 13 career touchdowns. Clay is 76 yards away from becoming HCC's 15th career 1,000-yard back and is 438 yards away from joining the Blue Dragon career Top 10 rushing list.

As a freshman, he rushed for 629 yards on 139 carries and tied for the team lead with 10 touchdowns. Clay had three 100-yard rushing games (103 vs. Coffeyville, 107 vs. Independence and 138 against Fort Scott in the Region VI semifinals).

Clay's Blue Dragon career to this point is progressing very similar to All-American Jamison Palmer, HCC's single-season rushing leader and No. 3 all-time rusher.

In Palmer's freshman season in 1997, he rushed for 611 yards and three touchdowns running behind 1,000-yard rusher Arland Bruce. When Palmer became the featured back in 1998, he rushed for a single-season record 1,576 yards and 17 TDs.

**ADAM DAVIS IS MOVING UP
CAREER QB SACK CHART**

Blue Dragon sophomore defensive end has a chance to put his name well up the program's career quarterback sack list.

Still looking for his first sack of 2009, Davis is fifth on the Blue Dragon career sacks list with 14.5 sacks. He is one sack away from surpassing Henry Thomas (1994) for fourth on the career list.

Davis, 6-1, 245-pound sophomore from Folkston, GA, has not gotten off to a fast start in 2009 battling a multitude of injuries. So far, Davis has just five tackles, only one for loss. He has also seen plenty of double-teaming by opposing offensive lines.

Davis had a stellar freshman season when he tallied 14.5 sacks in 2008. That was the third-most in a single season.

All-American Troy West (1996-97) is the Dragons' top QB sack artist with 34 sacks. All-American Antwaun Bynum (1998-99) is second with 20.

Davis is two sacks behind time Waddleston (1992-93) for third on the career list.

OFFENSIVE LINE PAVING WAY FOR BLUE DRAGONS

There is a big reason why Chris Clay rushed for 231 yards against NEO and Chris Anderson ran for a school-record six TDs against Highland. In fact, there are five big reasons.

The 2009 Blue Dragon offensive line has helped the Blue Dragons become the top-ranked rushing team in the NJCAA at 346.5 yards per game. The Dragons rushed for 405 yards against NEO and 288 against Highland.

Through two games, the Blue Dragon offensive line has graded out at 88 percent. Last week against Highland, sophomore center Chase Hartman graded out at 95 percent, while left guard Calin Archer has been above 90 percent in both games.

BLUE DRAGONS IN NATIONAL STATISTICAL LEADERS

The Blue Dragons continue to lead the NJCAA in rushing offense at 346.5 yards per game. Also, freshman running back Chris Anderson is tied for first in scoring with 42 points and is tied for first in the nation in touchdowns scored with seven.

Other Blue Dragons in this week's NJCAA national statistical leaders:

● Rushing: Sophomore Chris Clay is sixth at 147.5 yards per game. Anderson is 14th at 106.5 yards per game.

● Passing: Freshman Angelo Pease is tied for 44th in passing yardage at 89.5 yards per game.

● Total offense: Clay is 33rd at 147.5 yards per game.. Pease is 49th at 113.5 yards per game.

● Scoring/Kickers: Sophomore Kelly Roberts is tied for 14th with 14 points.

BLUE DRAGON DEFENSE LOOKS TO CONTINUE RESURGENCE

Hutchinson's defense was greatly improved in head coach Rion Rhoades' first season in 2007. The Dragon defense took it a step higher in 2008. Now Rhoades' defense looks to raise the bar even higher in 2009.

After a poor performance by HCC standards against NEO, the Blue Dragons rebounded strong last week against Highland in a 58-6 win. Highland had just nine rushing yards and 133 total yards. The Scotties took just three snaps in HCC territory.

For the season, the Blue Dragons are allowing 16.5 points and 257 yards of total defense.

The 2008 Blue Dragons led the Jayhawk Conference and was fifth in the nation in rushing defense that allowed just 74.8 yards per game.

The Dragons were No. 2 in the league and 15th in the nation in total defense allowing 251.4 yards per contest. HCC allowed 18.4 points per game, which was third in the Jayhawk Conference.

Rhoades' impact on the defense was immediate when he took over in 2007. After allowing a staggering 36 points and 418 yards to opposing teams in 2006, the 2007 Blue Dragon defensive unit allowed 22.4 points and 299 yards per game.

The 2009 HCC defense lost defensive tackle Eugene Kinlaw, the 2008 NJCAA National Defensive Player of the Year and all three starting linebackers.

Defensive end Adam Davis is back after an all-league season with 14.5 quarterback sacks. Starting cornerbacks Kendall Davis and Thad Williams are back, we well as starting safety Matthew Pearson.

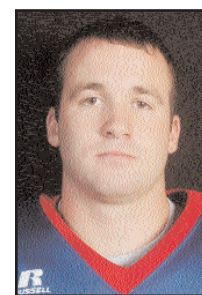
GAGE MCKINNIS IS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN RECEIVER

McKinnis led the Jayhawk Conference in kickoff returns with an average of 33.8 yards on 14 returns and two touchdowns of 97 against Dodge City and 82 against Air Force Prep. The 97-yard return against Dodge City was the second longest kickoff return in HCC history.

He was second in the league in punt returns at 14.1 yards per return on 11 returns. McKinnis had a major impact in the Dragons' 30-17 Region VI semifinal victory at Fort Scott when he returned four punts for 116 yards. His long of 65 yards early in the fourth quarter set up HCC's go-ahead score when the game was tied at 10-10.

McKinnis was second on the 2008 Blue Dragons in receiving with 13 receptions for 152 yards and one touchdown. McKinnis was also second in all-purpose yards with 1,031 yards.

DRAGONS MAKE GOWANS TOUGH PLACE FOR OPPOSING TEAMS

Over the years, Gowans Stadium has been a pretty good home for HCC. Built in 1940, HCC surpassed 200 wins at Gowans with a 45-13 win over Coffeyville in 2008. HCC is 202-104-8 at Gowans and 237-115-14 at home all-time.

This season marks the fourth year of the renovated Gowans Stadium. At an overall cost of \$5.5 million, Gowans Stadium received a major face lift that included a new FieldTurf playing surface, new drainage system, track, press box and many other features. Gowans now has a capacity of 5,000.

'DRAGONVISION' MAKES ITS DEBUT IN 2009 AT GOWANS STADIUM

The latest addition to the "New" Gowans Stadium is the "DragonVision" video board, which sits atop the scoreboard at the north end of the field.

"DragonVision" will enhance the fans' football experience at Gowans Stadium. Now Blue Dragon fans will get to see instant replays as well as highlight videos and other interesting features about HCC athletics.

"DragonVision" will be operated by the Hutchinson Community College Broadcast Production Department.

DRAGONS PICKED SECOND IN 2009 JAYHAWK PRESEASON POLL

The Blue Dragons received their highest preseason prediction since 1996 in July at the annual Jayhawk Conference Media Day.

The Blue Dragons were picked second behind defending NJCAA national champion Butler in the 2009 Jayhawk Conference Preseason Coaches Poll. Butler will be looking for its ninth consecutive conference championship this season.
