Cuonzo Martin - Head Coach
Missouri State University
2nd Season

Cuonzo Martin, former Associate Head Coach at Purdue University, begins his second season as the Bears' head coach in 2009-10. Martin was a star player at Purdue from 1991-95 for coach Gene Keady (Former Hutch CC Head Coach) and then played four years professionally. Drafted by the Atlanta Hawks. He coached at Purdue for eight years under Keady and Matt Painter. In Martin's first year at Missouri State, they had wins over Arkansas, Wichita State, Drake, and Evansville. Dick Vitale lists Coach Martin as one of the best up-and-coming young coaches in the country.



Brad Stevens - Head Coach
Butler University
3rd Season

Call Coach Stevens a quick learner. In a just seven years, he went from a promising business career to one of the most successful head coaching starts in the history of the NCAA Division I! Only one coach in NCAA Division I history has posted more wins than Stevens in their first two seasons. And the 31-year-old Butler Head Coach became the third-youngest Division I coach to guide his team to 30 wins - the youngest in more than half a century. Butler has also advanced to two straight NCAA appearances under Coach Stevens.

Steve Eck - Head Coach
Hutchinson Community College
1st Season

Coach Steve Eck brings a winning tradition to Hutchinson CC for his 1st season as Blue Dragon Head Coach. With successful stops at Butler County CC, Redlands CC, and Cowley College. At Redlands, Eck led the Cougars to the 2002 National Championship and runner-up in 2004. After a 182-22 record at Redlands, Eck took his career to Cowley College where he had a two-year stint with an overall record of 60-8 and two straight KJCAA East Conference Championships.

Chris Lowery - Head Coach
Southern Illinois University
6th Season

After taking over the program in 2004, Saluki Basketball has been on a sweet ride ever since. In his first year at the helm of SIU, all Lowery did was win 27 games and become the youngest coach, at age 32, to ever win Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors. The Salukis won the MVC regular-season crown and an NCAA 1st Round game. The program has continued its steady ascent. Known for his team's hard-nosed defense, Lowery is regarded as one of the brightest young coaches in the country.

Mark Cline - Assistant Coach
Oklahoma University
4th Season

Mark Cline was Jeff Capel's first hire upon arriving at OU. Cline served as an assistant coach for Virginia Commonwealth under Capel. He helped Capel compile a 61-31 record at VCU which included a 2004 trip to the NCAA Tournament. While at OU, Cline has helped the Sooners continue atop the Big 12 and National Rankings. This past season, the Sooners reached the top of the College Basketball Rankings ranking #1 in the country, and reaching the Elite 8 of the NCAA Tournament. Cline also helped to develop National Player of the Year and #1 Overall NBA Draft Pick Blake Griffin.
